Case discussion with John. John attended a final visit with Axel as his Order is very close to closure. During this visit Axel reported that his Dad has assaulted him. It is a rather complex situation but Dad was present when this allegation was made, he explained it in a different way and that he was the one who had been assaulted by Axel. Axel did not elaborate as to how he has been assaulted but Dad stated that Axel had kicked him between the legs. John and I discussed appropriate responses in relation to this. Axel has no visible injuries and the way in which he and Dad spoke of the incident makes it difficult to understand the true extent of what has happened. Having heard the information, I do not currently consider there to be immediate child protection concerns, as there is no evidence of physical injury to Axel. That being said, there is still a concern with the allegation that has been made and this may well fall under section 17 threshold. I have asked John to share the information with school and CFW as they are both involved with Axel and his family. I have asked John to ask if there are any other concerns from those agencies, with a view to developing a more thorough evidence base to then submit a section 17 referral to CSC. John spoke with the CFW worker who was aware of the situation as they had undertaken a visit after the event. They are in agreement with our considerations for a referral under section 17. Questions remain over whether this has indeed met thresholds, however it is still a relevant course of action as there would then be evidence in a chronology, should future allegations be made.

He is on High Support Tuition on 1to1 for one hour every day 2.30-3.30 with myself as teacher. From our point of view the risk is steadily reducing as far as we can observe. In September he was taught 1to1 with 2 staff present (myself and another member of staff). From mid October this is now 1 member of staff (myself). The school is now busier at his tuition times so he sees lots of other students on arrival and departure and seems to be coping well with this. We had an integration plan to introduce other students into the room but this has been stalled as the school had to close for 2 weeks due to Covid end of September. Rest assured we realise how important it is that he learns to get along with peers appropriately and safely and we will move forward on this when staffing and available students allow. We have discussed actions and consequences through use of English Language sources for GCSE which has proved useful I believe. I will discuss further with Mrs Hodson about the use of more direct support for reintegration (such as social stories, making good choices etc) so he feels happy and confident to move forward socially. Feedback from panel report. Hi John Having read Axel's report I would like to make the following comments – Axel should be commended on his continued engagement with LYOT on a remote basis due to COVID. I can appreciate the difficulty and unease this may present, so for Axle to continue with it is really encouraging. Axel should continue with this level of engagement. I note that professionals are coordinating an ASD assessment, which is key. Once Axel's needs are fully identified a robust package of support can be put in place with colleagues to not only reduce risk of reoffending, but to support his education and attainment. Axel and his family should engage fully in this process and work with professionals as required. Another positive is that Axel has had no further periods of offending and appears to have been compliant to government guidance during COVID. This should continue. It would be encouraging for Axel to engage in some way with his education – even if this is just speaking with his teachers. I appreciate this remote style of learning is not Axel's preference, however he will have missed almost a full academic years' worth of education upon his return in September. This is likely to have an acute impact on his educational achievements longer term. I hope this is ok? Many thanks, Rachel

Axel states he preferred living in Wales. Axel's brother [DPA]. He uses a wheel chair and this can sometimes mean that his father needs to care for him. Axel is with the Youth Offending team on a 10 month Referral order for an offence where he had gone into his former school after being excluded with the intention of harming a child who he feels had been bullying him. When the child was at school Axel attacked another YP as he felt he was going to get in trouble anyway. Axel was assessed by CJLD in the cells and it was felt there was a lack of remorse. Axel is being assessed for ASD after concerns were raised by a number of professionals. Axel has previously had private intervention for his emotional health. Axel is open to CAMHs and they have been liaising with Anne Simpson. Axel's education appears to be an issue. Axel was excluded from mainstream school in October 2019 following Axel calling childline and telling them he was taking a knife into school as he was being bullied. Axel was transferred to the Acorns in Ormskirk. When Axel committed his offence the decision was made that he would stay at home and work be sent to him. The police had stated that Axel couldn't return to education until CSC had put plans in place. There was a meeting in March 2020 whereby school stated that they couldn't assess Axels risk until YOT had done their assessment. This assessment was shared with school. School stated Axel could go back in a TAF meeting in May however, the day after they stated they felt it was too risk. This was challenged by Andrea Fontaine about why this was not brought up in the meeting and discussed a further meeting to discuss schools risk assessment. After this school attempted to arrange one to one sessions with Axel. However, Axel's father stated he did not want Axel to go back to school until after the summer holidays due to Covid 19. Axel was assessed by CSC after the incident. They felt there was no role for them as Axel is appropriately parented. This was stepped down to Andrea Fontaine at CFW who has recently (June 2020) ceased her involvement as he role was to support Axel's transition to education but he is no longer going back to school prior to September. School have raised concerns that father appears to mitigate Axel's behaviour. Alphonse appears to justify that Axel had taken a weapon into school because he was scared. This was challenged by Anna Croll from YOT stating this was not an appropriate response. Axel is currently in the process of being assessed for an EHCP. Janet Ramsay has had conversations with Anna Croll about this.

Email trail about Axel not returning to school until after the holidays and CFW withdrawing from family Good afternoon Jane, I have also struggled with engagement at times, however, more recently I have been able to maintain contact with Alphonse. There was no direct work with Axel specified when the case stepped down from Social Care, however it was identified that Axel would benefit from some work around social interaction and appropriate responses to support him when he returns to school. As discussed in the last TAF meeting (TAF notes attached), Axel is struggling to engage over the telephone and video call. It was discussed and agreed that for Axel to benefit from the work this would need to be carried out face to face, and that we would try to find a way to facilitate such work should Axel return to school this term, which we now know is not the case. I have encouraged Alphonse to allow Axel to return to school earlier, and I have informed him that Axel's transport is being looked into. Alphonse said he made the decision following a conversation with school and as he was given the option to wait until September he has chosen to take it. As a consensual service, if neither Alphonse or Axel want to engage with us until face to face support is an option then that is their choice to make. There are no safeguarding concerns I am aware of that would override the need for consent. We will refer Axel onto a transition zoom group supporting children in returning to school, in which Axel can interact as much or as little as he chooses, so for his own comfort, he could just listen. We will maintain intermittent contact with the family during these difficult times, with a view to reopen once Axel is returning to school, as this would be the most beneficial time to complete the work with him. In addition to this The Youth Offending Team will be maintaining regular contact with the family and Axel as per his court order, so there will continue to be professional oversight for the family over the summer weeks. In regards to the Home School Agreement, Alphonse did contact me as he could not decipher from the text message what the form was, and thought this form was for him to sign Axel out of school for home education. He did not have a copy of the form to send me so that I could see what it was and reassure him, so I suggested he take his time to read it and understand it before signing it. Alphonse has since said he has got the form and will return it by post. If there is a change of circumstance and Axel returns to school this term then we will of course happily stay involved to support him, providing both Alphonse and Axel consent and engage with our service. My manager Sharon Barrett is aware of the case and is happy to have a discussion with you about this if you so wish. In view of your email below indicating that it 'leaves little by the way of a role for our service at present,' I'm a bit concerned that if CFW isn't involved over the summer - when schools will not be in the position to make any provision for students - we will find it more challenging to reach Axel in September if he does not return soon. My understanding of working together to safeguard children 2018 with regard to early help services such as LCC CFW service, is that services should improve family functioning and build the family's own capability to solve problems. We are happy to work with you on this and you appear to be having more success than school. It would help us if you could continue to work directly with Axel over the summer? We feel the family need more support so that they do engage and trust us and he will eventually re-engage with some learning. Also there is a real need for services to work closer together during these unprecedented times We have made substantial efforts to engage Axel and indeed parents, to support him. However, they appear to be putting up barriers. We have tried various methods to provide learning for Axel and methods for contact to be maintained between him and specific staff. He won't engage with any of the learning. We can provide 1-1 teaching on site as described by Jo. We could have him taxied in and that is being looked at. We don't know of any other barrier? You appear to suggest there may be others? Today, colleagues went to the home to visit and asked parents to read and sign our reviewed Home School Agreement and behaviour policy, which is something we have to do as part of our risk assessment process advised by both the DfE and LCC. This is the case for all of our pupils and future admissions. I have learned that dad would not sign this today. This in itself is not a concern as I understand he may want to peruse it thoroughly, but I suspect he will not return it to us or may refuse. It's really essential our families understand why this is important at this time and all parents have been supportive. Is there a possibility that you could support with this? The picture for September is not clear for any school but the 1-1 teaching is in place. However, it is necessary that the family get the message from other services to consider Axel re-engaging as soon as possible. I welcome your thoughts in relation to this email. If this is the only barrier to Axel returning to school we can look at this again. There would have to be a risk assessment carried out by LCC transport first. We have offered Axel 1-1 with a specialist teacher in school, in the first instance. This would need to happen and be successful before we would be able to offer anything else. It's all about a graduated approach and assessing at every step of the way. If Axel and his family choose not to take up this offer, he will be taught via the virtual team, that is the only other option that he has. So far he has chosen not to engage with this. Email regarding school decision not to let Axel back in on one to one basis and summary of our assessment Hi all, Thank for your email raising concerns. Apologies for the delay in replying. My thoughts and observations are below. I have also included in this email my summary of my assessment of Axel. Axel has been assessed using the Youth Justice Assetplus framework. With regards to the email raising concerns I echo what Andrea has said. Although Alphonse's mind set in relation to the offence isn't conducive to helping Axel to understand the mistakes but we can continue to challenge this as I did in the TAF and as Andrea has offered to do in the future. I am also happy to have those conversations with father. We can also work with Axel to understand this too. When I spoke to him he appeared to realise to an extent that his actions weren't acceptable but it is an area for further work. I will also point out that given our definition of serious harm I would still assess Axel as medium risk of serious harm. Although I would agree that there is an increased opportunity to commit offences or serious harm I do not assess that this would push him into the realms of high risk by our definition. However, should new information come to light our risk assessments are reviewed regularly and when significant new information or incidents occur. If your risk assessment concludes that Axel can not be in a classroom or school environment it may be beneficial to discuss this with Axel and Alphonse so they full understand that decision and have the opportunity to challenge this appropriately. It will also need to be considered what provision would meet Axel's needs as the current provision doesn't appear to be meeting Axel's needs. I do recognise that Axel hasn't been completing work and been compliant with school however, it needs to be considered if there are alternative arrangements that can be made. Here is a summary of the Assetplus that I completed: RISK OF SERIOUS HARM: MEDIUM When considering this I have taken into account the definition of serious harm which is 'some risk identified but the offender is unlikely to cause serious harm unless circumstances change'. When considering risk of serious harm I have assessed Axel as medium risk of serious harm. When considering risk of serious harm I note that Axel hasn't caused serious harm in the past and has a short antecedent history however, there are concerns that Axel has carried knives in the past and used offensive weapons (hockey stick). Given Axel's lack of remorse at the time of being arrested there are concerns that he doesn't understand the severity of his actions which would be reinforced by father's views. Axel is able to vocalise that his actions were wrong but it is unclear if he has a deeper understanding of this or if he has adjusted his views to what he feels others want him to say. Axel has a potential diagnosis of ASD which may affect how Axel sees situations. Axel may not understand the potential serious harm that he could cause towards others. At this moment in time Axel has few interactions with peers which limits his opportunities to learn appropriate social responses rather than resorting to negative responses. I am concerned that should Axel feel a sense of injustice, grievance or conflict that he does not know how to respond to in a positive way that he may try to take matters into his own hands and resolve them in an inappropriate way which may harm others. RISK OF REOFFENDING: LOW I have considered that Axel has an extremely short antecedent history and appears to centre around October to December 2019 where on two occasions he was found with weapons. Axel appears to struggle with peer relationships and appropriate responses to conflict. Axel is currently being assessed for ASD which would affect how he perceives peer relationships and his interactions with his peers. Should Axel find himself in conflict with peers he may struggle to understand how to resolve these issues without resorting to conflict. Axel does not appear to fully comprehend the consequences of his actions. Axel stated he attacked the other young person as he knew he would get in trouble anyway but failed to see that if he complied with requests to leave the building he would have been in less trouble. It is concerning that Axel may not comprehend the consequences of his actions as he may not make fully informed decisions that may dissuade him from engaging in negative behaviours. Axel's use of the internet has previously been a cause for concern due to the content that he was accessing. However, Axel has been assessed by Prevent who do not believe there is a risk however, Axel could be vulnerable. Should Axel spend increased time on the internet on inappropriate sites he could be at risk of grooming into offending behaviour. At the moment Axel does not interact with his peers due to the Covid 19 pandemic and not being in education therefore, any opportunities to engage in negative behaviour are reduced. SAFETY AND WELLBEING: MEDIUM When considering Risk to Axel's safety and wellbeing I have assessed him as 'Medium' risk. Axel is very isolated and appears to struggle to make appropriate relationships with peers. It is suggested by some professionals that Axel may have a diagnosis of ASD which may put him at risk of bullying from his peers as he may struggle to relate to them appropriately or not react in a 'normal' way to a situation. When considering physical wellbeing Axel has carried weapons in the past which puts him at risk of harm from the emotional impact of using the weapons or physical harm from being harmed with his own weapon. Axel's internet has sometimes been inappropriate which may lead to both physical and emotional harm. Axel has been accessing inappropriate content online which may affect his emotional wellbeing. This also puts him at risk of grooming from others online. Please do not hesitate to get in touch if you have any questions. Thanks, Anna

Email from school and response from CFW. YOT response on case note dated 22/5/2020 Good morning, Thank you for your email raising concerns. I appreciate there is concern and frustration around the perceived mind-set of Alphonse and Axel. This can be challenged through conversation with Alphonse, which I am happy to do. However, I don't feel that this increases the risk posed by Axel, because there is appropriate parenting in place. In terms of Alphonse wanting mainstream schooling for Axel, he also mentioned the possibility of an alternative provision being suitable, but at the end of the meeting was in agreement with, and showed an understanding of, Axel returning to Acorns on a 1:1 basis, and awaiting the decision in regards to the EHCP request. In any case, Alphonse's view of his son's temperament and behaviour, and his expression of his preferred educational placement, does not, in my opinion, influence the risk level. As discussed in yesterday's meeting, Anna's risk assessment is not the basis for Axel's return to education. Therefore I think it would be beneficial to have a copy of your risk assessment to be able to see exactly where within school the risk lies and what measures can be put in place through the TAF process to support it. Perhaps we could arrange a TAF meeting for the week following half term, as I feel it would be beneficial for these concerns to be raised during the meeting to allow appropriate challenge on some of these issues. This gives Alphonse an opportunity to respond to the challenge and provides Axel with an opportunity to contribute his thoughts, feelings and wishes. I can appreciate that all necessary strategies need to be put in place to ensure everyone's safety, however there does not appear to be any new or additional information shared that would suggest an increased risk. Axel is annoyed by it and Dad doesn't know how he will respond. "It agitates him and his reaction is not the Axel we know at home". • Dad does not see any value in any of the work we do at The Acorns, he seems to think our pupils all have learning difficulties. He does not accept that Axel is with us for a specific reason. • He is of the opinion that Axel needs to be at a mainstream school supported by a TA. I did state in the meeting that Axel would not be able to go to a mainstream in the immediate future, but I'm not sure whether Dad accepts this, as he repeated the request later in the meeting. • Dad seems to perceive that Axel is the victim rather than the perpetrator. He excuses his behaviour, even excusing him carrying a knife "because he was frightened". Anna did point out that this was still not an appropriate response, but Dad did not seem to accept this and seeks to deflect blame. • Dad stated that he is "A very good child, very respectable, but "If you do something to me, I do something to you harder"". Dad agreed that Axel needs help in learning that this is not an appropriate response, but then stated that Axel can be immovable and once he's made his mind up that's it. This concerns me as potentially any work we do with Axel might be undermined by Dad. • So far we have had complete non compliance with school work provided. Dad expressed his concerns that The Acorns do not teach Axel in the way he likes to learn, which again is deflection as he has been offered a lot of support, including daily phone calls and emails and individual support from senior teachers via Microsoft Teams. • Anna discussed that YOT considered that there was medium risk of serious harm but because of lockdown imminence wasn't there. If we do bring Axel back in 1-1 with a specialist teacher, we will then have opportunity and imminence. In view of the meeting yesterday, I feel that Axel poses to us all as a school has increased rather than reduced. I have a duty to both staff and pupils in raising my concerns with you. Initial panel meeting conducted over the phone. Due to the current circumstances Axel was spoken to over the phone about what was expected of him. Axel agreed to keep in contact with the YOT. Alphonse was also informed of the conditions of his contract. I explained that a panel volunteer would read his report and give feedback. I will ring Axel and his father later in the week to give him feedback from the panel volunteer. Email below regarding the Panel volunteer feedback. Hi Anna After reading Axel's report the main thing for me is his isolation. He states he has not been able to joint clubs before – however I would like Axel to reflect on what he would choose to do. What are his interests and what are his skills. Is he able to research what his in his local community whilst we are on lock down? Can we contract for parents to support Axel with this and to start to look at opportunities for him to proactively engage within his community and with his peers. As he enjoys TV and games, is there anything around either medium when choosing his reparation? Could he do a story board for a game relating to knife crime or assault for example? Axel needs to be supported to understand the consequences of his actions and this needs to be done with mindfulness of a potential ASD diagnosis. It sounds like Axel was subject to bullying – I would like him to explore the affects this had on him and how best he could have dealt with it. If this was a trigger for offending behaviour, Axel needs to have coping strategies in place and build his resilience should he be faced with a similar situation. It is positive that Axel has been so open and honest and has engaged well to date. I would like for this to continue. It is positive to read that Axel is academically able. I would like it for Axel to engage with education and be proactive when able to do so. Whilst off school due to the coronavirus, I would like Axel, with the support from his family, to engage in some on-line learning to support his progression. Is this ok? I'm finding it all a little strange at the moment to get my head around! I hope this email addresses them. Regarding work: Originally we asked Axel to complete written work with instructions provided and stamped addressed envelopes, to return the work for marking. Axel declined to do this work apart from one piece of Maths which was marked and retained in his school file. A lot of work was sent out weekly. Subsequently, work was set mostly online for Axel to work at his own pace and do the work in short bursts, which he said would help him stay motivated. The work set does not have a 'target' to reach. At Acorns, we generally do not teach towards specific targets in tasks. Teachers create tasks so that pupils acquire knowledge and retain and deploy that knowledge over time. Therefore, some tasks are repetitive because they consolidate learning in ones memory. This is the best way to learn. That is why we have provided Bitesize for the science subjects whilst he could not come to school. You may recall, Axel only wanted Maths Science and English work? We have also created a section on the school website signposting to many resources that can be used by all our students and their families. We did this rapidly and whilst working from home. We are developing this further for all our pupils. All parents have received texts to indicate when the website has new updates. Regarding targets: At Acorns, pupils work to target grades or levels. I sent a copy of his CATS assessments to Anna Jameson on 25/2/20 to share with you when you made the parental request for statutory assessment. I have attached them for you here, so you can see what target grades he was working towards when in school. Regarding concise and finite exercises: If Axel is accessing his Microsoft 365 account regularly, he will see that work has been set up for all pupils in 'Teams'. A Team group has been set up for Axel and core subject teachers; Mrs Stephenson for Maths, Miss Evans for English and Mrs Low for Science. During this unprecedented situation, our pupils are working with staff via Teams. Pupils are accessing work, responding to their teachers and getting guidance from their teachers. Some staff have created and posted YouTube videos to teach a particular topic or to explain how to learn something. Our records show that Axel has been doing Maths via MyMaths. Other work has now been set for him at GCSE level which will be challenging for him and he won't be bored doing this. However, I advise Axel to contact his teachers directly on the above emails in order to arrange a video call through Teams. He can speak to any of the teachers and they can guide him relating to any of the work for all subjects provided in Teams. This can be done between the hours of 9am and 3.30pm but Axel must email the teachers first, so a time and day can be agreed. Teachers are responding to pupils in this way. Of course none of us can guarantee a good online connection - everyone is using this technology presently. My concerns regarding contact: My colleagues (Emily Forrester and Carol Rooney) are contacting you daily to check that all is well and if Axel or anyone else in the family requires support. Carol calls you on Tuesdays and Thursdays and Emily Monday Wednesday and Friday Unfortunately, contact with you is minimal and you do not answer the phone or return our calls. Our records show that you do not respond to most of the daily calls. It is really important that you respond to these calls as this is how we can help you if there are any issues around learning or general welfare. We are working together with other services to assist families during these circumstances and colleagues from YOT and Children and Family Wellbeing Service have shared concerns that you have not responded to their calls also. I strongly advise you to answer your telephone so that any needs can be met timely and appropriately. Hoping you are all safe and in good health. I'm just a little confused as I had understood that the FSW would be going through the request for statutory assessment information with the parents. This is somewhat delayed now, however, you have outlined process for the family and Acorns now have a plan in terms of provision of education. I would ask that this is put in a letter to the parents and the provision is reviewed regularly and in line with the Asset Assessment work being completed by YOT. This work will be lengthy but will inform partners in terms of the needs and plans moving forward for Axel. Anna - Please could I ask that we have minutes from the meeting held last week. Jo and I visited Axel and his parents at home last Friday. It was explained that it was necessary and appropriate under the circumstances to draw up a risk management plan for Axel to return to an educational placement and that the YOT assessment by Anna would assist us. I also explained that it was important for Axel to attempt the work set by teachers. From now on, we are going to send him work online/ electronically and parents are happy for this pending risk assessment. It was explained that at present, remaining on our school roll is the only option available and if parents want Axel to return to a mainstream school, then any school would want to see that Axel had successfully managed his placement here at Acorns and that there were no risks. They appeared to understand this. Dad did comment that Axel is not a risk at home or to himself. However, he further commented that he would be a risk elsewhere, because if someone did something to him, he would do something in return. He added that Axel does not understand when to let go, he holds on to things. Parents appeared somewhat confused and unsure about the statutory assessment for an EHCP. The process of applying for statutory assessment was explained and I pointed out that as they were making a parental request, they must complete the necessary documentation. I explained the timescales - if that request is agreed and proceeds - and who would contribute in terms of providing 'advice'. We offered to assist if they required further support after they met with SENDIASS. If there is any further updates available from anyone please keep us informed.
