The family were open at CIN level following an incident last year when Axel had repeatedly taken a knife into school, and after being permanently excluded he returned to school and assaulted another young person. Axel was convicted and received a youth offending order and has been working with them over the past year. The family were stepped down to CFW service during covid-19 restrictions, Axel struggled to engage over the phone and video call,. The family was supported to ensure Axel had a school place and could attend education. There were no safeguarding concerns it was agreed the case would close and reopen once Axel returned to school and direct work can be completed face to face.

Axel is a 14 year old boy who lives at home with his mum, dad and brother. Axel's basic care needs are being met and this is evident through observation. Home conditions have been observed to be good. Axel reports to have good relationship with his mum and brother Dion. Axel has been attending school every day since they reopened in September, school report that he is working very hard and making good progress. He has an EHCP. Axel is open to the youth offending team and they have reported he has been engaging with sessions with them for the passed 12 months, this is due to end in January 2021. Laetitia reported that her relationship with Axel is good and Axel agrees with this, There are some communication issues between Axel and Alphonse which can lead to arguments and then Axels behaviours escalate.

Dion is a 16 year old boy who is **DPA** a wheelchair user. Parent's report to be meeting all of Dion's needs. School have informed that they have no concerns for Dion, he has 100% attendance and presents well. He is excelling since starting at sixth form.

Analysis and Initial Action Plan

Analysis of Needs and Risk:

What is your analysis?

From gathering information there are no safeguarding concerns at this stage for either of the children. Their basic needs are being met by parents, and overall they have a safe, stable and happy home life.

The family were previously open to CSC and had a C&F assessment. They have also has support from parenting 2000 in Southport, which proves their ability and willingness to engage in services to the benefit of the children and family life.

There are no unmet needs identified for Dion and parents feel that all the support services are in place and do not want him to be part of the CAF.

Axel has involvement with the Youth Offending Team regarding incidents of carrying knives and assault. Although it is relevant to mention this incident, it is not the main focus of this assessment. Axel has shared that he is struggling with his anxiety, and he feels that previous professional involvement has focussed on the incident of assault and carrying knives and that no one has thought about or supported him with his feelings and emotional wellbeing.

Axel has previously disliked attending Acorns and struggled with peer interactions. This currently is not an issue as Axel is receiving 1:1 tuition, however it is important for his ongoing development and future education that Axel learn to manage these social situations.

I think that supporting Axel with his social needs and anxiety will not only support his education going forward but also his family relationships. It would also be beneficial to complete work with Alphonse separately and jointly with Axel to support their relationship and communication.

It is important for Axel to have influence over the work that is completed with him to ensure continued engagement, as Axel will disengage if he feels that there is no benefit to the work being done. Axel has previously received support from CAMHS in Sefton, but decided not to continue with this as he felt it was not beneficial to him.

There have been no violent/aggressive incidents from Axel since last year, which was under very specific circumstances, and there are no safeguarding concerns for either child. In addition to this Axel is now regularly attending school therefore this case sits at level 2 on the continuum of need.

He has shared that he felt that previous professional intervention was so focussed on the assault and weapon charge, that no one took the time to find out his feelings or what was going on with him. Axel has stated he feels anxious a lot and doesn't leave the house

Feeling Safe	Alphonse feels safe at home, however there have been some incidents of drug dealing on their estate and police raids. Alphonse said the children do not play out or walk the streets unaccompanied so they are safe. Alphonse informed there is some historical bullying with Axel but he doesn't have those concerns now, although it worries him that Axel was able to take knives and weapons into school.							
Being Well (body and mind)	Dion is a wheelchair user, [redacted] DPA and struggles socially, he does not have any friends and finds it extremely difficult to speak on the phone. Axel is suspected to be ASD and Alphonse is pursuing this as long with ADHD screening. Axel struggles with social circumstances and is not going out at all other than to school. No medical, mental or physical health needs in parents.							
Home and Money	The family have lived in their current home sine 2016 and they are happy there. The boys have their own bedroom. The house is not specially adapted for wheelchairs. Alphonse has some credit card debts but says this is manageable, and said the family are just getting by. I asked if there was any financial hardship, Alphonse said no, but they would like a holiday which they can't afford at present.							
Friends, Relationship and Support	Alphonse would rate relationships within the family as a 5, but external relationships and support would be a 2 Alphonse feels that he an Laetitia have good relationship with each other and the boys. There are no extended family close by. Alphonse said that he and his wife have some acquaintances from work who they would go for a drink with, but don't necessarily consider them friends. They had a group of friends from the same cultural community but that was prior to moving to Banks so they don't have that community anymore. neither Dion or Axel have friends. Axel had some friends but fell out with them. Alphonse says both boys are isolated and antisocial. They is just the 4 of them.							
Work, Education and Learning	Both Alphonse and Laetitia work. Laetitia is still working as she is NHS staff, Alphonse is working as a taxi driver although he spends most of his time caring for the boys and is considering suspending work due to Covid-19, he tries to be flexible about the boys needs. Dion is doing well at sixth form and there are no concerns with his education Axel is attending Acorns every day at present and is working 1:1 with a teacher for 1 hour per day, he has been working hard and school have been happy with him this first half term.							

Goals and Ambitions	<p>Alphonse's would like Axel to live a full and healthy life, he wants him to be comfortable going out and having experiences</p> <p>Alphonse would also like to be less isolated - which he feels is difficult to do at the moment because of Covid-19 restriction.</p>
Feelings, Behaviours and Choices	<p>Alphonse feels that they can struggle with communication with each other, he doesn't always understand their language or 'banter' and can think they arguing, but they aren't, although they do bicker from time to time.</p> <p>Alphonse feels that he can be 'silly' at times, but Axel is very serious so this is a barrier to their communication as well.</p> <p>Alphonse said the boys to not spend time together and have very different interests so are often doing different things in different rooms.</p> <p>Dion likes using the computer, Axel is mostly watching TV as his consoles were seized by the police following his arrest.</p>
Boundaries and Behaviours	<p>Axel can throw things on the floor and stomp slam doors when angry but this is infrequent.</p> <p>There is no physical aggression for either of the boys, but they are both stubborn and like things their own way.</p> <p>Axel can be argumentative with Alphonse, but responds well to negotiation and explanations. Both Follow the rules and there are consequences in place for when they don't.</p> <p>Alphonse stated that sometimes he feels like he doesn't want to 'take Axel on' as he doesn't want things to escalate.</p>
