Report from Acorns School in Ormskirk to the Early action team regarding concerning behavior of a pupil who was accessing videos of mass shootings and appeared to have an obsession with guns and beheading. Early Action liaised with the CT prevent team who were looking into this behavior. A few days later this same pupil visited a school in Formby armed with a sharpened hockey stick and a knife intent on harming named individuals. He assaulted a pupil and was arrested by Merseyside Police. EA officer PC Paul Harrison was informed of this arrest by the school and immediately linked in with Merseyside Police to update them about the previous concerning behavior. As a result the young person was seen by the custody mental health team who conducted a full assessment and MERPOL conducted a S18 at the home address and seized phones and computers. Paul also liaised with Prevent who have raised the risk of this individual and visited the home address and liaised with parents gaining their support regarding strategies to reduce the risk from their son, ensure he abides by his bail conditions and report him immediately should he go missing. Paul also liaised with RAT and CI Jones so the risk could be effectively managed while the investigation continues. This demonstrates the value of partnership working which allowed Paul to share information and fully inform another force about the wider risk an individual posed and ensure safeguarding is in place.

Hi maam.

Im just letting you know of a rather concerning young individual that I have "sort of" been dealing with.!!

Axel Rudakabana 10 Old school close ,Banks

Axel is a 13 year old who attends Acorns School in Ormskirk.

Acorns contacted Child and Family wellbeing at the grove in Burscough due to some very concerning behaviour. Due to me having frequent contact with the Grove they sought advice from me .

Acorns divulged that Axel had been accessing mass school shootings on line at the school,he has an unhealthy obsession with guns,he draws disturbing pictures and talks about beheadings.!!!He had been expelled from a school in Formby for taking a knife in.

Speaking to all the staff in my office and Sgt Bramhall it was decided quite rightly that this info should not sit with us and should be sent to the Prevent team .The school duly sent off the relevant referral form to Prevent.

Due to their concerns Acorns were keen to get some contact with Prevent so I followed this up and linked in with the Prevent team .They informed me that the info was with their intelligence team and they were doing background checks.

However.....

On Wednesday 11th December Axel ,after pre ordering a taxi the day before ,he visited his old school in Formby armed with a sharpened hockey stick and a knife naming individuals that he wanted to kill.!! Thankfully the individuals weren't at the school but he ended up assaulting another pupil.He was duly arrested by Merseyside Police.

Acorns were informed by the school in Formby who in turn contacted myself. I therefore made contact with the custody office in Merseyside as well as the sgt in their cpt to inform them of the background info and Axels concerning behaviour .I was then contacted by the custody mental health nurse and also gave them the info to do a proper assessment.

Due to giving Merseyside this info they decided to do sec 18 search of his house and seized his phone and computers .he is currently on bail with various conditions.

I also have liased with our Prevent team who have unsurprisingly raised the risk of this individual .

On Friday 13th December I attended the west lancs RAT meeting to update CI JONES and INSP Kanoun .They thanked me and requested that I visit the home address to discuss safeguarding with the family and I therefore did this and spoke to mum about supervising Axel at all times and ring the police if he disappears.

Parents are alarmingly playing the situation and his behaviour down.

After speaking to sgt lewis Hiag I am attending a strategy meeting Tomorrow at Skem regarding Axel.

Nobody told me I would be dealing with terrorists!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!
