1 - Key Information about the child and any changes. At the end of his order Axel continues to live at home with his parents and brother. At the end of the Order Maggie Allred High Support Teacher at Acorns School advised that Axel has excellent attendance and works hard every session.

2 - Update on progress: Axel has engaged well on his Order. Due to Covid the initial part of the order was completed via the telephone. Axel is suspected to be on the autistic spectrum and he struggled with the phone calls and so once Covid restrictions were lifted he was seen in person at home. Axel engaged well and he completed all the interventions required on his Referral Order contract. Axel has not missed any appointments.

3 – Update on Restorative Justice Interventions: Due to Covid 19 Axel has been unable to complete reparation.

4 - Parent/ Carer views: Axel's parents advise of no concerns with Axel's behaviour either at home or at school.

5 – Any ongoing support needs and things to be considered for exit planning:

Axel has a supportive family who want to make sure he has a good education.

For Axel to keep attending education as required and for his parents to support and encourage Axel to attend.

Axel appears to relate well to visual things such as TV programmes or video games.
